GENERAL RULES

Use or copy the entry blank on the back of the Premium Book. Complete entries with the correct lot number in numerical order. The correct LOT NUMBER is very important, as only the numbers are checked during judging. Any questions contact the respective superintendent for assistance.

1. Non-animal entries must be made on **Wednesday, July 23rd between noon and 7 PM**. Livestock can be entered on **Wednesday, July 23rd, between 12 noon and 7 PM** in the open class building **ALL Livestock must be registered by 7pm July 23rd if they want to participate in an open class show.**
2. **Pre-registrations are accepted online or mailed until Friday, July 18th, 2025** with Jodi Gerner.
3. Each exhibitor is allowed two entries per lot number except for animal entries.
4. All entries must be in the name of the owner and must have been raised or made by the exhibitor during the past year.
5. Judging of open class exhibits will commence on **Thursday July 24th, at 9AM**.
6. Entries for premiums in the individual lots of grain, field seed, fruits, and forage cannot appear as parts of collections.
7. No article or animal shall compete for more than one premium except livestock competing in teams or groups, 4-H animals or FFA animals. This rule shall not bar sweepstakes or special premium competition for which no entry is required.
8. Every Article in competition must correspond in number and description with the premium list and be in its proper place in order to obtain premiums. No change or alteration will be permitted after the books are placed in the hands of the judges.
9. No animal or article will be assigned a place on the grounds until entry is complete.
10. Each entry tag shall be securely attached to the entry, stall, pen or receptacle in which it is shown.
11. All entries must remain on exhibition until **Sunday July 27th, 4:30 PM**, the last day of the fair.
12. Entries may not be removed before the above hour under penalty of forfeiture of premiums, except by permission of the fair secretary.
13. Exhibition of articles not competing for premiums must be arranged for at the Secretary's Office.
14. Ample accommodations will be provided for all collections. Collections must be neatly arranged and completely labeled. A duplication of varieties in any collection shall bar the collection from prize money. Standard varieties will be given preference.
15. Superintendents in charge of different divisions will group each lot in the various classes.
16. All articles entered at the Fair must appear in their respective classes as set forth in the premium list. Under no conditions will premiums be paid on articles not listed.

17. In case special awards are made they will be awarded place of merit, provided the judges so desire.
18. If a class has only one exhibitor and is not deemed worthy of first premium, the judge at his/her discretion may place an award of second prize on the entry.
19. If a class does not have 4 or more entries, not all premiums must be awarded. This is at the judges discretion.
20. No one, including exhibitors, will be allowed to sleep on the fairgrounds without previous permission from the Secretary.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

1. Persons who desire space on the grounds must apply with the Secretary.
2. The Fair Board reserves the right to remove an offensive exhibit.
3. The Ag Society will take every precaution for the safety of articles and stock on exhibition, but is not responsible for any loss or damage that may occur in the delivery, exhibition or removal of the exhibits.
4. The Kanabec County Agricultural Society Board reserves the right to interpret these rules and regulations and settle any questions or differences.
5. Police presence and night caretakers will be provided, but the Ag Society is not responsible for any damage to property, and has no liability for personal injury which may occur to any exhibitor or visitor while attending the Fair
6. Any accident on the fairgrounds must be reported immediately to the Fair Office, located in the civic center
7. As designated by the Kanabec County Agricultural Society Board of Directors, any protest action is allowed only on the grassy area to the south of the Union Street exit and east of the small parking area next to Lions Park.
8. No person will be allowed to distribute advertising material on the fairgrounds, except from their place of business or exhibit. The tacking or posting of any advertisements, bills, cards, etc., other than within the space occupied by exhibitors, is prohibited. The distribution of handbills, flyers, heralds, etc. is prohibited.
9. Alcoholic beverages are allowed only in the designated area.

AWARDS

1. The Superintendent of the Division or their appointee shall assist the awarding committee as clerk, and will keep a record of the awards. When completed this record will be signed by the awarding committee and returned to the Secretary.
2. Divisions I - O: May enter two entries per lot per exhibitor in Divisions Senior, Adult, Teen and youth.
3. Awards on entries shall be designated as:
 - First: Blue
 - Second: Red
 - Third: White
4. Divisions I - O Awards: *(ribbons until run out & then stickers will be used in lieu of ribbons)*
 - Blue \$3.00

- Red \$2.00
- White \$1.00

Divisions I - O Awards Youth: *(ribbons until run out & then stickers will be used in lieu of ribbons)*

- Blue \$1.00
- Red \$0.75
- White \$0.50

5. All awards shall be made by comparing the merits of the entries.
6. Any interference by exhibitors to influence or dictate the decision of the judges will be cause for excluding that entry from competition and should be reported to the Secretary through the Division Superintendent.
7. An exhibitor may protest a decision to the Superintendent of the Division at the time of award. The superintendent can require the judges to give reasons for their decision. No appeal of the decision by the awarding committee will be allowed.
8. No awarding committee may award discretionary premiums. Whenever articles of superior merit are exhibited for which no premiums have been offered, the awarding committee may enter "commended" on the book of awards the Secretary can report to the Ag Board for future action.
9. Premiums will not be awarded on articles of inferior merit, regardless of the number in competition for a premium. The judge may award no premium, second, or first premium as merit may warrant, stating the reasons in writing when requested. Special premiums may be offered by interested persons for entries that conform to the general classification of the Ag Board.
10. If a class has less than 4 entries, not all awards must be given.
11. ****Premium checks not cashed within Sixty (60) days after issue date are null and void.**

RULES AND REGULATION

1. A plate of apples must consist of four specimens; grapes, two bunches; crabapple, four specimens; plums, four specimens. Not more than one plate of any variety will be allowed in any collection, competing for premium; nor shall there be synonymous entries. Any exhibitor violating this clause shall forfeit the premium money for this lot.
2. All fruits and vegetables must be shown in uniform open receptacles of the proper size to contain the sample. Shortage in count will disqualify a sample from competing.
3. The superintendent will provide plates and uniform label cards to be sure that they are properly attached to all fruit and vegetables entered.
4. The exhibitor must keep his entries in tidy condition during the time they are on exhibition. specimens may be added to any sample, after any judging of the lot to replace those which have deteriorated. The Superintendent will ensure that any manifestly unsightly or unfit samples are removed.

**DIVISION - L
PLANTS AND FLOWERS**

RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Open to all growers.
2. Only entries listed will be permitted in this class
3. No endangered plant protected by Minnesota State Statute 84.0895 may be displayed
 - a. **Endangered plants** are those “upon a showing that such species is threatened with extinction throughout all or a significant portion of its range
 - b. **Threatened plants** are those “upon a showing that such species is likely to become endangered within the foreseeable future throughout all or a significant portion of its range” 40 species – 22 families
 - c. **Special Concern plants** are those “upon a showing that while a species is not endangered or threatened, it is extremely uncommon in Minnesota, or has unique or highly specific habitat requirements and deserves careful monitoring of its status. 87 species – 34 families
4. The decision of the judges is final
5. Exhibits may be entered on Wednesday from **noon to 7pm**.
6. One entry per lot from an exhibitor.
7. Containers must be furnished by the exhibitor. Place cut flowers in bottles of good proportion. Prop the specimen securely upright.
8. All plants and flowers must be grown by the exhibitor for at least three months. **PURCHASE DATE MUST BE BEFORE MAY 1ST**.
9. Planters, dish gardens and arrangements must be the work of the exhibitor. Use only natural plant materials, fresh, treated or dried. Design classes must be predominantly fresh except where class specifies. Flowers must be garden grown, except for wild materials Mats, accessories, backgrounds, bases may be used in design classes.

TIPS FOR EXHIBITORS

1. Allow time to set up exhibit
2. Follow fair schedule, list flowers to exhibit with lot number
3. Only specimens meeting specification listed in schedule will be judged
4. Specimens should be free of insect damage, dirt, blemishes, with attractive foliage attached. Remove foliage below waterline
5. Hybrid tea roses and dahlias should be dis-budded 25 days before show time.
6. Blooms should be as identical in size, shape, etc. if more than one is required. Cut stems to display flowers well.
7. Harden flowers. Use a sharp knife to cut flowers. Place immediately in warm water. Keep cool overnight (Hardened flowers and foliage make the best arrangements.)
8. Place your name on the bottom of property.

3. Articles must be finished work, fully displayed
4. Lace means: crocheted, knitted, tatted or made by hand.
5. A Sweepstakes prize of \$3.50 will be awarded to the best quilt for Division M, Class 3 or Division P, Class 2 to be sent to the State Fair.
 - a. NOTE: No entry for crazy quilts or yo-yo quilts will be awarded the sweepstakes prize as they will not be accepted at the State Fair. They are eligible for prizes at the County Fair.
6. The best rug from Division M, Class 7 or Division P Class 1 will be awarded a \$3.50 sweepstakes prize and will be submitted to the State Fair.
7. Persons receiving sweepstakes in either quilts or rugs will be required to attach a statement from the County Fair Secretary.

1. Natural Colors- Using seeds, stems, etc. in natural colors on a supporting background. No paints or dyes of any kind. No irregular forms (must be square or rectangle). Must include a hanger to display on the wall. **Surface area must be completely covered.**
2. Dyed or Painted- Using seeds, stems, etc in natural colors, painted, or dyed on supporting background. Paint on background can show up to 30% of the surface area. No irregular forms (must be square or rectangle). Must include a hanger to display on the wall.
3. Irregular Forms- Using seeds, stems, etc. in natural colors, painted, dyed or combinations on supporting background. Forms other than rectangular or square, can be cut outs or shapes, or 3D as long as they are covered with seeds. Not limited to flat surfaces. Must not be framed. If able to be hung, must include a hanger to display on the wall. Up to 30% of surface area can be left uncovered.
4. Flat surface arrangement- using dried plant materials in natural colors on supporting background. Up to 30% of the background is allowed to be uncovered (70% must be covered in seeds/plants matter.)
5. Dried natural plants parts - Using dried plant materials such as tree or shrub seeds, fruiting structures, bark, pods, nuts, leaves, cones and at least three kinds of field crops seeds or plant parts, and seed and fruiting structures of any horticultural crop (optional) in natural colors on supporting background. Plant materials must be from plants that are adapted to growing in Minnesota. Any form. Any shape. All seeds and dried plant materials must be natural colored: no paint allowed. Up to 30% can be uncovered.
6. Special Occasion- Using materials, forms or techniques as allowed in any class listed, to depict one of the following: any national holiday (United States), anniversary (wedding, historical) birthday greeting, religious holiday or event, or any other special event (holiday, anniversary or tradition). Caption or theme must be included. Any form; hanging or standing. Up to 30% can be uncovered.
Very open, both in technique (can use paints/dyes, dried plant parts, any shape) and occasion (can be well known holiday, a little-known anniversary, or a personal milestone).
7. Seed and Plant Craft Objects- Objects made of or decorated with seeds, stems, etc. Natural color, painted or dyed. Examples: corn shuck dolls, caricatures, straw or stem structures, straw basket, shoes adorned with seeds, seed chains, key chains, etc. Up to 30% can be uncovered.
