1. Livestock can be entered on **Wednesday July 23rd, between 12 noon and 7 PM** in the open class building. Any Livestock not entered by 7pm on July 23rd will not be able to participate in their open class show.
Pre-registrations are accepted online until Tuesday, July 22nd or mailed until Friday, July 18th.
2. Each exhibitor is allowed two entries per lot number.
3. All entries must be in the name of the owner and must have been raised or made by the exhibitor during the past year.
4. No animal shall compete for more than one premium except livestock competing in teams or groups, 4-H animals or FFA animals.
5. No animal will be assigned a place on the grounds until entry is complete, fees paid and entry numbers assigned.
6. Superintendents in charge of different divisions will group each lot in the various classes.
7. In case special awards are made they will be awarded place of merit, provided the judges so desire.
8. If a class has only one exhibitor and is not deemed worthy of first premium, the judge at his/her discretion may place an award of second prize on the entry.
9. No one, including exhibitors, will be allowed to sleep on the fairgrounds without previous permission from the Secretary.

SAFETY AND SECURITY

1. Persons who desire space on the grounds must apply with the Secretary.
2. The Ag Society reserves the right to remove an offensive exhibit.
3. The Ag Society will take every precaution for the safety of articles and stock on exhibition, but is not responsible for any loss or damage that may occur in the delivery, exhibition or removal of the exhibits.
4. The Ag Society reserves the right to interpret these rules and regulations. Two members of the Ag Society Board will meet to discuss any issues and settle any questions or differences.
5. The Ag Society is not responsible for any damage to property, and has no liability for personal injury which may occur to any exhibitor or visitor while attending the Fair.
6. Any accident on the fairgrounds must be reported immediately to the Fair Office, located in the civic center
7. As designated by the Kanabec County Agricultural Society Board of Directors, any protest action is allowed only on the grassy area to the south of the Union Street exit and east of the small parking area next to Lions Park.
8. No person will be allowed to distribute advertising material on the fairgrounds, except from their place of business or exhibit. The tacking or posting of any advertisements, bills, cards, etc., other than within the space occupied by exhibitors, is prohibited. The distribution of handbills, flyers, heralds, etc. is prohibited.
9. Alcoholic beverages are allowed only in the designated area.
10. Dogs four months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of rabies vaccination issued by a licensed veterinarian. All dogs on the grounds must be leashed.

LIVESTOCK ENTRIES

1. Judges of cattle, goats and hogs will consider symmetry, early maturity, size and general characteristics of the breeds to which the animals belong; they will make proper allowance for age, feeding and other circumstances affecting character and condition of the animal
2. Exhibitors of livestock must report to the Show Superintendent before each show. Entrants must confirm with the Barn Superintendent of the division when their stock will be judged and be on hand to lead the animals into the show ring promptly. Any person failing to comply with this order will be disqualified.
3. All Animals must be shown in the name of the recorded owner as shown on the Registration Certificate; an exhibitor may show no more than two entries in any one lot.
4. Calves under two months old are ineligible for competition.
5. Animals on exhibition will be shown to the judges under the supervision of the respective Superintendent.
6. Registered stock animals over one year of age shall be accompanied by a certificate of registry, in the stud-book, herd-book or flock-book, recognized as being authentic for the breed the animal represents.
7. Purebred animals under one year of age are not required to show certificate of registry, but the exhibitor of the animal is required to give a certified statement that both the sire and the dam of the animals are properly registered purebreds.
8. All booths and livestock stalls must be cleaned at the end of the Fair before premiums are paid
9. There is a \$3.00 entry fee per animal for all Open Class entries, except for 4H animals at the fair for the duration of the fair. Entry Fees must be paid and show numbers must be assigned prior to show.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. All animals must be examined by the official veterinarian on the day of they are admitted to the exhibition. All out-of-state animals must meet Minnesota IMPORT requirements. No animal may enter or be at a public exhibition that is showing clinical signs of any infectious, contagious or communicable disease.
2. All tests must be conducted prior to the exhibition and a record of the test results on a test chart must accompany the tested animals.
3. All livestock shown shall have a USDA approved identification tag or tattoo.
4. The Official Veterinarian will order the immediate removal to a quarantine facility or removal from the exhibition premises (with notification of the secretary) of any livestock with symptoms of infectious or communicable diseases.

GOATS

Goats exhibited must bear an official ID which includes the flock scrapie eradication program number. This identification may be tags or tattoos but must be unique to each animal. Owners must provide their scrapie eradication program premise number at entry. No sheep or goat that is within 30 days of giving birth may be exhibited without prior approval from the Board of Animal Health.

SWINE

Swine must be individually identified with an ear tag or tattoo.

DIVISION - B BEEF CATTLE

Animals must be on Fairgrounds and registered one hour prior to the show. Two entries allowed in each lot.
